



Fall Bulb Planting Guide

Plant now for a stunning display of spring color! This guide provides planting depths, spacing, and bloom times for popular bulbs suited to Zone 6a.

Bulb Type	Planting Depth	Spacing	Bloom Time	Notes
Tulips	6–8 inches	4–6 inches apart	Mid to Late Spring	Plant pointy end up; prefers well-drained soil.
Daffodils	6 inches	6 inches apart	Early to Mid Spring	Naturalizes easily; deer resistant.
Hyacinths	4–6 inches	4–6 inches apart	Mid Spring	Fragrant blooms; handle bulbs with gloves.
Allium	6–8 inches	8–12 inches apart	Late Spring	Tall blooms; excellent for cutting gardens.

Planting Tips:

- Plant bulbs in the fall before the ground freezes.
- Choose a sunny location with well-draining soil.
- Add bone meal or bulb fertilizer to the planting hole.
- Water thoroughly after planting and mulch lightly.
- Leave foliage to die back naturally after blooming.
